

What is an ETA?

- Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA) is required by eligible passengers visiting the UK who do not currently need a visa for short stays and do not have a valid UK immigration status prior to travelling.
- An ETA is a digital permission to travel to the UK
- An ETA is required from 25 February 2026 for all visitors to the UK who do not need a visa, including students on an exchange programme.
- An ETA is not a visa, but travellers cannot board transport to the UK without either an ETA or a valid UK visa.
- British and Irish citizens, those with current UK immigration status, and UK Visa holders are exempt from needing an ETA.
- **Students studying on programmes of longer than 6 months require a Student Visa, not an ETA.**

Who Needs an ETA?

- Visiting students attending short courses of up to 6 months (e.g., exchange students or pre-sessional English language students), visiting research students or students returning post-visa for re-sits.
- Students must be from a country that qualifies for visa-free travel: <https://www.gov.uk/check-uk-visa>
- ETAs are valid for two years or until your passport expires — multiple entries allowed.
- ETAs allow a stay in the UK of up to 6 months for study, tourism, business, or medical visits.
- An ETA permits travel to the UK for short-term study. It does not permit study of longer than 6 months or employment/paid work in the UK.

How to Apply

1. **Use the same passport** for the ETA application as you will use to travel to the UK – the ETA links directly to your passport.
2. **To apply, you will require**
 - A valid passport
 - Credit/debit card to pay the £16 fee
 - Digital passport-style photo
3. **Apply** via:
 - The [UK ETA App](#) (mobile scanning features)
 - The app is the easiest way to apply, but you can apply [online](#) if necessary

Digital support with applications is available via an [ETA webchat](#). The webchat is operated by UK Government officials Mon- Fri, 9am -5pm (UK time) and via webform outside these hours.

4. **Wait** for an email with a 16-digit ETA reference (usually within 48 hours; if not received after 3 working days [contact UKVI](#)).

5. **Travel:** present your passport at check-in and border control — a printed ETA is not required.
